

## Bravo! Early College High School

### Twin Brothers Set Their Sights on Success



Peter and Paul Caroline are both "Super" Seniors at Franklin County's Early College High School. The 18-year-old twin brothers are going places, as each of them received QuestBridge scholarships, valued at over \$300,000 each, and have been accepted into two of the nation's most prestigious universities.

Peter, who's just 23 minutes older than Paul, will attend Stanford University in Palo Alto, California next Fall and plans to study Biology and Biomedical Science. Paul will attend the University of Pennsylvania, one of just 8 schools in the prestigious by League that includes the likes of Harvard, Yale, Princeton, and Brown, just to name a few. Paul has set his sights on Cell and Molecular Biology, and it's clear that both brothers have a knack for science.

According to their website, QuestBridge is a national non-profit scholarshipgranting agency that works to connect the Nation's most academically exceptional, low-income students with top universities. The scholarship not only covers the cost of tuition for the pair, it provides for their college expenses in entirety, including a stipend for students to live on and a trip to western Europe during their college career.

As you'd expect, both Peter and Paul are extraordinarily humble young men who are consistently working to support each other and their classmates; the quality of their character becomes visible within just a few moments of speaking with them. They will both cross the stage in May with a high school diploma and two Associate's Degrees each from Vance-Granville Community College – a first for the high school.

According to Early College Principal, Erica Shoulders-Royster, when she joined the ECHS team earlier this year, the twin brothers were on her radar before she walked in the door. "Peter and Paul are two of the first students I heard about before arriving to the school," she says adding that, "they are loved and respected by both their peers and teachers." Shoulders-Royster is confident the two have very bright futures ahead as students and individuals, saying "the best is yet to come for these two young men and we are so very proud of their achievements."
