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SHARON BILLINGS TEACHES AT ECHS (March 23rd)

Society Member, Sharon Billings, on March 23rd discussed and demonstrated Plant Genetics and described work career opportunities in available in that field with students in three of Sanjana Sharma's Earth Science classes. ECHS Teachers are always looking for career professionals to visit and speak about how they discovered their career path and descriptions of the types of available work.



ENVIROTHON COMPETITION (March 22nd)



For the first time, ECHS fielded 22 of Sanjana Sharma's Earth

Science students (5 Teams) at the NC SCS (Soil Conservation Service) Division IV Envirothon Competition held at the NCSU Beef Research Farm in Butner, NC. About 300 Students from High Schools across this 8 County Region attended. The competition is centered on four universal testing categories (i.e., soils and land use, aquatic ecology, forestry, and wildlife) and a current environmental issue. The Top Scoring 7 Teams qualify to go to the NC Statewide Competition to be held at the end of April at the NCSU Main Campus in Raleigh. ECHS did not qualify this

STEM GARDEN UPDATE (March 23rd)

The seeds planted on March 9th have begun to germinate with better progress showing in the cold frames as expected, but also under the row cover cloth and even in the bare soil raised beds sections. The weather has been very cold and wet, but the seedlings (lettuce, cabbage, spinach and radish) are surviving! Students are also experimenting with seed germination at home-standard seed germination rate test protocol between damp paper towels-varying the water pH to see the effects. Ken Billings and Bob Radcliffe will continue to provide help.
